- "Building cooperation and trust."






The Three Long-Term Priorities

External CBSS Cooperation

- External cooperation includes regular consultation and participation in joint activities and projects:
 - 4 regional Councils in the North (CBSS, NCM, BEAC, AC)
 - initiatives embracing the Region as the Northern Dimension, EU
 Strategy for the BSR and others
 - international organisations in Europe (Council of Europe, Organisation for Security and Cooperation in Europe)
 - international organizations, macroregional organisations in other parts of Europe
